

I met with Judge Moore for two one hour appointments on April 13, 2007 and April 20, 2007. He described in detail for me the complaints that had been upheld against him and the steps he had already taken to assure that conduct of this type would not happen again. We focussed on both external and internal precipitants of his behavior.

Judge Moore has made significant strides in identifying and remedying the external stresses that probably contributed to his losing patience and verbally acting out. He now takes breaks during the day, does not skip meals and has negotiated with the Lynnwood Court to hire someone to take some of the caseload burden off him. All of these are positive steps and should help him avoid losing control.

Judge Moore has also explored on his own and with me historical and personal factors which might predispose him to be more reactive in certain situations like those which are currently of concern. I feel he has been active in trying to understand what are his "buttons" and to plan ways to be more aware of when he is more vulnerable. He is also more aware of when he is becoming stressed and will do what he needs to do to not let this escalate.

I feel that Judge Moore has actively and systematically addressed the issues of concern and has developed strategies and skills to avoid repetition of them in the future.


